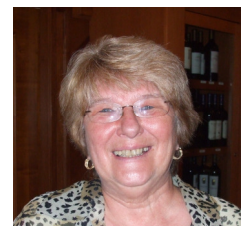

Harbor House

Harbor House seeks to eliminate domestic violence by providing safety, shelter, counseling, education, advocacy and justice. Since the inception of the domestic violence movement in the 1970's, Harbor House has been highly regarded as one of the best comprehensive domestic violence programs in the State of Florida. We have five main programs to support our mission: emergency shelter, children's services, community outreach, legal advocacy services and community & professional education. The main program is the 110 bed emergency shelter that is operated 24 hours a day for women and child survivors of family violence. This life saving program has been in operation for 34 years and is the only State certified domestic violence shelter in Orange County.

BETA Center

Our mission is "to provide children and parents with the knowledge and support needed for strong and healthy families". BETA Center is a private, nonprofit organization with 35 years of experience helping families, regardless of age or economic status, in the greater Orlando area including Orange, Osceola and Seminole counties. With a focus on parenting, teen moms and at-risk families, BETA Center changes behaviors and lives. The agency offers a wide range of services to support children and families, increase healthy family functioning and prevent child abuse and neglect.

We reach more than 17,000 people annually through the areas of Parenting Education Services, Pregnant/Parenting Teen Program, Neighborhood-based Family Services, Emergency Family Support Services and the Residential Program. BETA Center's method to create neighborhood-based family support is the basis for many area collaborations, and our Pregnant/Parenting Teen Program is a nationally recognized model. We work in partnership with our community to identify family support needs. We work in partnership with our clients to help them achieve their goals. The BETA Center staff and our 600 volunteers feel that it is our privilege to work with families.

JMJ Life Center

JMJ Life Center, established in 1990, is a nonprofit community service, offering free pregnancy tests and services designed to help families faced with the challenges of an unplanned pregnancy. We are a crisis pregnancy center in Orlando that provides free assistance to women regardless of age, marital status, religion, or race.

Our goal is to support the God given right of every pregnant woman to give birth and the right of every unborn child to be born, by providing assistance before and after the birth of their babies. We have three locations with trained volunteers available daily, to listen and provide help to families. We have helped over 50,000 families since we opened in 1990 and last year alone, we had over 4000 client visits for pregnancy tests and baby supplies.
